Sponsored Student Update

Jules is a healthy 6 year old girl who just finished second grade at EMEVO Primary School. But just a few months ago, she battled a painful health scare. Her troubles began when she fell into the cooking fire at home and badly burned her knee. Her mother tried a home remedy of putting mashed fried rice and tomato paste on the burn. but that didn't help-in fact it probably made it worse.

The second degree burn was infected. When Nurse Betty Paul saw Jules at school. she knew right away that she needed urgent care. CCH doctors treated Jules at the Primary Care Clinic and prescribed antibiotics and bandages. Miss Paul helped change the bandages at the right intervals when Jules was at school.

CCH school nurses treat acute issues like Jules' burn and they also identify larger community health issues. Many of our students suffer from anemia and CCH was recently able to address this by adding "iron fish" to the cooking pots for school lunches. Cooks have been trained in how to utilize and care for these special implements that boost the iron level in the students. hot lunches. Each iron fish will last for many years and should continue to reduce the symptoms of anemia.


Share Your Harvest!


Bible Bunch
