



We once again worked with our friends at Red Cross using the "Pathway to Health" interactive game. We continued our education on body development and safety with the "Days for Girls" and "Men Who Know" curricula. Also along the theme of "health and safety" our Occupational Therapist, Sachelie Jean Louis and some of her Clinic staff visited camps to work with kids who have special needs.

The campers also had lessons on art, history, science experiments, games, song and dance. They played with all kinds of building blocks and toys—special thanks for the Legos donated by Vienna Presbyterian Church families!




Summer Mission: COMPLETE! Care Packages for Teen Girls in Foster Care



Did you know?

- The word "picnic" derives from the French term "piquenique."
- Originally, a pique-nique was a social event, either indoors or out, where each guest brought a dish or contribution to the feast.
- In the 16th century, "pique-nique" described diners who brought their own wine when eating out.
- The largest ever picnic was attended by 22,232 people in Lisbon, Portugal, in 2009.
- The world's longest picnic table was assembled in Memphis, Tennessee, in May 2019. It measured 1,332 feet long and seated over 1,000 people.
