
Weekly Intergenerational Study




Bible Bunch

No WAY you already knew this about turkeys!

Judas why don't you carve the turkey since you're so good at stabbing things in the back



- Gender can be told by their droppings: Male turkey droppings are J-shaped, while females produce spiralshaped ones.
