








Plastic Bag Recycling Project



Did you know?

- St Patrick's name was actually Maewin Succat, and he was from Wales, not Ireland. At the age of 16 he was captured by Irish pirates and taken to Ireland as a slave. He tended sheep there for 6 years until he escaped back home. After becoming a priest and taking the name Patricius, he returned to Ireland and established the Christian church there.
- Like Christmas, Easter has roots in both Christianity and ancient pagan culture.
 Though it is mostly considered a religious holiday, many of our modern traditions are rooted in pre-Christian practices. Easter actually originated as an ancient pagan celebration of the spring equinox.
